- All courses noted with an asterisks * symbol are general studies courses and are offered in a variety of formats. They could be fully online, in-person or a combination of both. These classes are suggested to be completed prior to program start.
- ^ Courses are theory courses that are offered online. Exams will be Online Live on Thursday's from 6-8 p.m.
- ^^ Courses are theory courses that have an in-person lab component. In-person labs for part-time ADN students will be held at the Shell Lake Health Education Center.
- # Courses are clinical courses. Students will be placed in a day or evening clinical at a north or south campus location. Clinical courses may be six to eight hour shifts. Clinicals may start as early as 6 a.m. for a day shift and 2 p.m. for an evening shift. Clinical courses also require simulation, which will be in person at the Shell Lake Health Education Center beginning Fall 2022.



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Nursing Clinical Information

Semester Two | Long-Term Care Facility

This clinical will be eight-weeks long and held on Wednesdays and Thursdays. Clinical will be in the evening.

Semester Three OB, Community

This clinical will be the 2nd eight weeks and held on Thursday and Friday. Clinical will be in the evening.

Semester Four | Med/Surg

This clinical will be the 2nd eight weeks and held on Tuesday and Wednesday. Clinical will be in the evening.

Semester Six | Med/Surg | Psych

Eight weeks of Med/Surg, four weeks of psych and four weeks off. This clinical will be held on Tuesday and Wednesday. Clinical will be in the evening.

Semester Seven | Med/Surg | Simulations

Eight weeks of Med/Surg and Simulations. All students go to Med/Surg the 2nd eight weeks of the semester. It will be held on Thursday and Friday. Clinical will be in the evening. Simulations will occur after completion of Med/Surg and will be determined by the clinical instructor.

Semester Eight | Clinical

Four-week clinical: 90-hour preceptor-led clinical that will be held at a variety of sites. Students will be asked which sites they may be interested in completing this clinical. For this clinical, students will complete their hours during the hours the nurse preceptor is assigned. This could be days, evenings, nights or weekend hours and can be eight to 12-hour shifts.

Grade Requirements

All courses in the ADN program (coure nursing, science, general studies, prerequisites and electives) must be completed with a grade point average of 2.0 or better, including 10806177 General Anatomy & Physiology and 10806179 Advanced Anatomy & Physiology.

Financial Aid Information

Students who complete all general education courses prior to starting the ADN Part-Time program will have difficulties with financial aid. Financial aid requires that students enroll in at least six credits. If you have completed or will complete all general education courses prior to starting, please make sure to meet with your advisor to discuss your options.
