

Community College Survey of Student Engagement (CCSSE)

2024 Administration

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Executive Summary

Process

In the spring term of 2024, Northwood Technical College administered the Community College Survey of Student Engagement (CCSSE). The survey was conducted online and open to credit students who met criteria determined by CCSSE.

2,290 Northwood Tech undergraduate (UGRD) and extended education (EXED) students were invited to complete CCSSE. 356 students responded to the survey, representing a 16% response rate. The 2024 Small School Cohort, which Northwood Tech was part of, included 250 total institutions whose enrollments were under 4,500 students. The overall 2024 CCSSE Cohort included 456 total institutions in 46 states, the District of Columbia, Marshall Islands, and Micronesia.

CCSSE uses five benchmarks that allow colleges to monitor their performance in areas that are focused on teaching, learning, and student success. These benchmarks include Active & Collaborative Learning, Student Effort, Academic Challenge, Student-Faculty Interaction, and Support for Learners.

Findings

Northwood Tech's highest scoring category was Active and Collaborative Learning. Compared to the Small School Cohort, Northwood Tech underperformed in all benchmark categories during the 2024 administration.




Figure 2 and 3 show the largest differences in mean scores for the level of student engagement between Northwood Tech and the 2024 CCSSE Cohort. Figure 2 shows the five highest items of student engagement. Two of the five items were also in the Top 5 during the 2021 CCSSE administration. The five lowest student engagement items (Figure 3) are all the same items that scored lowest during the 2021 administration.

Aspects of Highest Student Engagement, Northwood Tech vs. 2024 CCSSE Cohort




Nearly all (96.4%, 286 respondents) of Northwood Tech respondents indicated they would recommend Northwood Tech to a friend or family member (Figure 4). 91.1% (271 respondents) evaluated their entire educational experience at Northwood Tech as 'excellent' or 'good' (Figure 5).

a Friend or Family Member




Introduction

Background

In the spring of 2024, Northwood Technical College participated in the Community College Survey of Student Engagement (CCSSE). CCSSE is a national student survey focused on teaching, learning, and retention in community colleges. The study helps community and technical colleges assess quality, identify good educational practices that help students learn, and identify areas in which colleges can improve. Northwood Tech has participated in this study since 2002.

CCSSE is an initiative of the Center for Community College Student Engagement at The University of Texas at Austin.

Purpose

CCSSE examines both institutional practice and student behaviors with respect to retention and learning. The survey gathers information about students' college experiences, including how they spend their time, what they feel they have gained from their classes, how they assess their relationships and interactions with faculty, counselors, and peers, what kinds of work they are challenged to do, how the college supports their learning, and more. The survey builds on "extensive research about educational practices directly related to student retention and other desired student outcomes.".1

A sample copy of the survey instrument can be found in Appendix A.

Method

Process

Northwood Tech administered CCSSE in an online format to all eligible students as specified by CCSSE. The survey was available to 2,290 undergraduate (UGRD) and extended education (EXED) students who met the following criteria:

- Enrolled in at least one credit bearing or developmental education course
- At least 18 years old
- Not incarcerated
- Not enrolled exclusively in courses offered entirely to high school students

Survey administration began on March 25th, 2024 and initially ended on April 19th, 2024. The survey deadline was extended by the Center for Community College Student Engagement and it remained available until May 15th, 2024. Weekly e-mail reminders were sent through the duration of the survey. In addition, social media posts, learning management system (LMS) announcements, and reminders from faculty during classes encouraged students to complete the survey.

356 Northwood Tech students responded to the survey, a 16% response rate. The average response rate for colleges in the 2024 Small Colleges Cohort was 18%.

Respondent data are excluded from CCSSE reports when one of the following conditions are met:

- The respondent did not indicate full-time or part-time enrollment at the institution.
- The survey is invalid. A survey is invalid if a student does not answer any of the 19 sub-items in item 4, answers *very often* to all 19 sub-items, or answers *never* to all 19 sub-items.
- The respondent indicated his/her age as under 18.
- The respondent did not indicate their gender identity (Gender is left blank).

Survey Respondents

CCSSE asked several questions to determine background information of the survey respondents at Northwood Tech. The 2024 survey takers were:

- 68% female
- 84% white
- 51% online students (item 32a)
- 62% enrolled full-time
- The top three responding age groups were:
 - o 21% were 18 to 19 years old
 - o 19% were 30 to 39 years old
 - o 18% were 40 to 49 years old

Personal life

- 41.9% were working for pay more than 30 hours per week (Item 10b).
- 23.8% were providing care for dependents living with them more than 30 hours per week (Item 10d).

Educational Background

 Nearly 30 percent (29.9%) started their education somewhere else and transferred to Northwood Tech. This means more than 100 students transferred to Northwood Tech last year alone. This gives those students a comparison institution to compare our services and opportunities against (Item 1).

Current Education Status

- 67.6% of students took day classes (morning or afternoon) compared to 29.9% taking evening classes or 2.5% taking weekend classes (Item 31).
- Almost a third (31.7%) of respondents were attending Northwood Tech with a goal of transferring to a 4-year college or university (Item 26c). This is an increase from 2021 but still much lower than the 67.1% in 2017 who attended Northwood Tech (then known as WITC) with a goal of transferring to a 4-year college or university.
- 96.4% of survey respondents would recommend Northwood Tech to a friend or family member (Item 35).
- 91.1% of survey takers rated their educational experience at this college as *Good* or *Excellent*, with 54.9% choosing *Excellent* (Item 36).


Findings

CCSSE Benchmarks

CCSSE uses a set of five benchmarks of effective educational practice in community/technical colleges. These benchmarks allow participating colleges with missions focused on teaching, learning and student success to gauge and monitor their performance in areas that are central to their work. They also allow colleges the opportunity to compare their performance to other similar colleges. The five benchmarks are:

- 1. Active & Collaborative Learning
- 2. Student Effort
- 3. Academic Challenge
- 4. Student-Faculty Interaction
- 5. Support for Learners

These five benchmarks have remained consistent over time which allows Northwood Tech to compare institutional scores across the years. The chart below shows the benchmark scores for the last four administrations of CCSSE.



A three-year cohort model was used for comparing data across colleges. The 2024 CCSSE Cohort includes 456 colleges who administered CCSSE between 2022 and 2024. Participating colleges are also categorized into one of four comparison groups – small, medium, large, and extra-large – based on enrollment size. Northwood Tech is considered one of 250 small colleges who participated in this cohort. In the benchmarking sections below, you will see five items in which Northwood Tech scored highest in student engagement and five items where the college scored lowest in student engagement relative to the total 2024 CCSSE Cohort.

A complete listing of all 2024 CCSSE Cohort colleges by comparison group can be found in Appendix B.

Active and Collaborative Learning

Students learn more when they are actively involved in their education and have opportunities to think about and apply what they are learning in different settings. Through collaborating with others to solve problems or master challenging content, students develop valuable skills that prepare them to deal with the kinds of situations and problems they will encounter in the workplace, the community, and their personal lives.²

- Ninety-eight percent of respondents indicated some level of active participation in class, leaving only 2% responding that they Never "asked questions in class or contributed to class discussions."
- Compared to the 2021 administration of the CCSSE survey, which was conducted during the pandemic, students report participating in more in-person opportunities that support Active and Collaborative Learning:
 - The percent of respondents who reported working with other students on projects during class *Often* or *Very Often* increased 10% from 2021.
 - The percentage of students that responded *Never* to the items below decreased in six of the seven categories.
 - The percentage of students that responded Often or Very Often to the items below increased in six of the seven categories.

Student Effort

Students' behaviors contribute significantly to their learning and the likelihood that they will attain their educational goals. "Time on task" is a key variable, and there are a variety of settings and means through which students may apply themselves to the learning process.³

- Although students reported coming to class more often without readings and/or assignments complete (item 4.e). this item was highlighted as one of Northwood Tech's Highest Aspects of Student Engagement relative to the rest of the 2024 CCSSE Cohort.
- Item 10a. "Preparing for class (studying, reading, writing, rehearsing, doing homework, etc.)" was also highlighted as one of Northwood Tech's Highest Aspects of Student Engagement, where the percentage of Northwood Tech respondents who responded spending 11 or more hours preparing (38.0%) was higher than the 2024 CCSSE Cohort (33.6%).
- The percentage of students who used Peer or Other Tutoring (5.3%), the Computer Lab (10.0%), or Skill Labs (4.8%) 5 or more times in the last academic year were called out as three of Northwood Tech's lowest aspects of student engagement compared to the 2024 CCSSE Cohort (8.8%, 13.9% and 11.9%, respectively).

Academic Challenge

Challenging intellectual and creative work is central to student learning and collegiate quality. Ten survey items address the nature and amount of assigned academic work, the complexity of cognitive tasks presented to students, and the standards faculty members use to evaluate student performance.⁴

• Item 5f. "Using information you have read or heard to perform a new skill" was highlighted as one of Northwood Tech's Highest Aspects of Student Engagement, where the percentage of Northwood Tech respondents who selected *Quite a bit* or *Very much* to this question (78.9%) was higher than the 2024 CCSSE Cohort (70.9%).

Student-Faculty Interaction

In general, the more interaction students have with their teachers, the more likely they are to learn effectively and persist toward achievement of their educational goals. Personal interaction with faculty members strengthens students' connections to the college and helps them focus on their academic progress. Working with an instructor on a project or serving with faculty members on a college committee lets students see first-hand how experts identify and solve practical problems. Through such interactions, faculty members become role models, mentors, and guides for continuous, lifelong learning.⁵

- Email communication continues to be a frequent form of communication between students and instructors. Only 3 students (0.9%) responded to *Never* having communicated with their instructor via email over the last academic year.
- The frequency that students are discussing grades, assignments, and readings with an instructor has decreased since the 2021 administration (items 4k and 4m).

Support for Learners

Students perform better and are more satisfied at colleges that are committed to their success and cultivate positive working and social relationships among different groups on campus. Community college students also benefit from services targeted to assist them with academic and career planning, academic skill development, and other areas that may affect learning and retention. ⁶

- Over 80% of students feel that Northwood Tech "provides the support they need to help them succeed at this college", which is consistent with the results from the last two CCSSE administrations. This was highlighted as one of Northwood Tech's Highest Aspects of Student Engagement, where the percentage of Northwood Tech respondents who selected *Quite a bit* or *Very much* to this question (86.3%) was higher than the 2024 CCSSE Cohort (78.8%).
- 42% of 2024 responding students feel that Northwood Tech "Helps them cope with their non-academic responsibilities (work, family, etc.)" Quite a bit or Very much. This was another one of Northwood Tech's Highest Aspects of Student Engagement compared to the rest of the 2024 CCSSE Cohort.
- The percentage of students using Career Counseling services has increased since 2021. 17.6% of responding students have used Career Counseling 2 or more times compared to 10.3% in 2021. However, this was noted as one of Northwood Tech's lowest aspects of student engagement in 2024.
- CCSSE's Executive Summary also noted that the frequency in which students use Academic
 advising/planning is one of Northwood Tech's Lowest Aspects of Student Engagement compared

Importance and Satisfaction of Support Services

Survey respondents were asked about their usage, satisfaction, and rating of importance of 13 different college services. For usage, students were asked to rate the services on a four-point scale: *Never, 1 Time, 2-4 times,* and *5 or more times.* For satisfaction and importance, students were asked to rate the services on a three-point scale: *Not at all, Somewhat,* or *Very.* For all rankings of these services, refer to item 12 in Appendix C.

- In 11 of the 13 services, more than 75% of students responded that they had used the service only 1 time during the current academic year or they hadn't used the service at all.
- The 3 most used services at Northwood Tech include Academic advising/planning, Library resources and services, and the Computer lab. These all had less than 70% of students responding as *Very Satisfied*. This is an area of opportunity.

2024 Special Focus Questions - The Working Learner

In the 2024 CCSSE survey, survey respondents were asked 15 additional questions about their work status while they were enrolled at Northwood Technical College. These questions were new in 2024 and do not have any comparison data from previous CCSSE administrations. 64% of survey respondents have worked for pay every term they were enrolled at Northwood Tech. While many students are balancing school and work, more than 60% indicated that being an employee and a student are both equally important.

- More than 60% of responding students are not receiving Pell Grants (question 1).
- Almost a third (32.4%) of responding students are working more than 40 hours a week while enrolled (question 3).
- Of the students that are working for pay, more than half (53.3%) responded that their job determines if they can enroll full-time or part-time (question 7).
- Of the students that are working for pay, more than half (52.2%) responded that their job is related to their program of study (question 8).
- More than half of responding students (58%) said staff members have not helped them decide
 how to balance the number of classes you take and the number of hours you work for pay
 (question 15).


