TEST-TAKING

Assumptions

- Students will have read all assigned material prior to coming to class.
- Students will receive access to a copy of the course competencies, learning objectives, and course grading requirements at the beginning of the course.
- All exam questions are based on course learning objectives.
- All handouts, assigned readings, and media are sources of exam questions.
- The entire course outcome summary (competencies, learning objectives, and required readings/media) may not be covered in class but will be considered testable material.

Instructor's Role

- Provide content covered in class and indicate which additional content, readings, and media are considered testable materials.
- Make available all required media for review.
- Present additional/supplementary material, when available.
- Provide an explanation and/or blueprint of content in the exam prior to the test date.

Suggestions for Test-Taking

- Use resources on test-taking skills, available in the Academic Support Center at Northwood Tech.
- Match each objective to the content of the outline. Look up the page numbers in the book that cover it. Make your own outline of the material.
- Pay attention to any keywords in an objective like "occupation-based."
- Look at any review books that would let you practice answering questions, if this is an area you are weak in.
- Do some relaxation techniques to help you feel less overwhelmed by the volume of material.
- The Academic Support Center can be of assistance to you if you have test-taking concerns.
- Ask questions early on, allowing for sufficient time to seek clarification on concepts, strategies, and expectations prior to deadlines.
- The program director/student advisor/instructor(s) are here to help you; don't hesitate to ask for help.
