Course Types

General studies courses are offered either fully online, in-person or a combination of both. It is suggested that these classes be completed prior to starting the program.

Skills* course with an in-person lab at the Health Education Center (HEC) in Shell Lake (approximately thirteen days (7.5 hours/day) during the first eleven weeks of semester two).

Skills course with an in-person lab that will take place at the student's home campus (approximately one to two days per week for the first four weeks of semester six).

Theory courses are delivered online with select exams requiring students to take at home campus-see course schedule for details. Most exams will be scheduled Online Live on Tuesday or Thursday from 6-8 p.m.

Clinical courses and require time on campus, at the HEC, and at off-site clinical sites near a north or south campus. Please see semester specific information for each clinical course below.

➤ Nursing Clinical Information

Semester Two

Intro to Clinical Care Practice | 10-543-104

This clinical course is during the last five weeks of second semester and includes five clinical days, three days on campus, and one day at the Health Education Center.

Semester Three

Clinical Care Across Lifespan | 10-543-107

This clinical course is during the first eleven weeks of third semester and includes multiple individualized community clinical experiences, five days on campus, and two days at the Health Education Center.

Semester Four

Intro to Clinical Care Management | 10-543-108

This clinical course is during the last five weeks of fourth semester and includes four clinical days, three days on campus, and one day at the Health Education Center.

Semester Six

Intermediate Clinical Practice | 10-543-116

This clinical course is during the last twelve weeks of sixth semester and includes nine clinical days, one day on campus, and three days at the Health Education Center.

Semester Eight

Advanced Clinical Practice | 10-543-115

The first clinical (115) of eighth semester is during the first twelve weeks and includes nine clinical days, three days on campus and one day at the Health Education Center.

Nursing Clinical Transition | 10-543-116

The second clinical (116) of eighth semester is during the last four weeks and includes sixty-four clinical hours and five days on campus. This clinical is led by a nurse preceptor and hours will be completed during the hours the preceptor is assigned.

➤ Grade Requirements

All courses in the ADN program (core nursing, science, general studies, prerequisites and electives) must be completed with a grade point average of 2.0 or better.

➤ Financial Aid Information

Students who complete all general education courses prior to starting the ADN part-time program may have difficulties with financial aid. Financial aid requires that students enroll in at least six credits. If you have completed or will complete all general education courses prior to starting, please make sure to meet with your advisor to discuss your options.
