Skills Assessment Guidelines

Understand that Skills Assessments are evaluative, rather than learning, experiences. Results indicate only whether a student has earned credit for prior learning: pass or fail. No score is available, nor is a report of how a student performed on any piece of the assessment.

- Prior to taking the skills assessment, you must:
 - ✓ be an admitted student.

- The skills assessment may be scheduled before or after the course begins, but must be completed within the first seven calendar days from the course start date.

Process:

- Student completes Letter of Intent and submits electronically before or at time of scenario.
- Student is provided a copy of the Course Outcome Summary, HPS Scenario, and grading rubric.
- Student schedules HPS appointment.
- Student arrives on time for HPS appointment. Care Plan is completed during this time.
- Instructor provides feedback and grade after scenario.
- RECOMMEND a video recording of the HPS scenario for further review and feedback to student.
