WHAT STUDENTS ARE ELIGIBLE?

Students must be pursuing a degree in Early Childhood Education (see full list below).

Students must also be eligible to work in the U.S. and meet one of the following:

- 1. Individuals whose employment status at any time was impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic **OR** -
- 2. Self-employed individuals who became unemployed or significantly underemployed as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic **OR** -
- 3. Individuals who have no work history or are entering the workforce for the first time

Students could be eligible for additional assistance through additional workforce programs. This will be determined by other workforce agencies you may be referred to.

Students must be in enrolled in QUEST <u>prior</u> to the start of the semester. This grant is currently available to students. Grant funding will end September 2024.
