

## **Career path**

UW-Whitewater's online criminology program is for law enforcement professionals looking for an opportunity for career advancement in areas of police department leadership, security, parole officers and corrections.

Criminology is one of the areas of emphasis available with UW-Whitewater at Rock County online Bachelor of Applied Arts and Sciences (BAAS), specifically designed for working adults to offer them a flexible degree completion pathway. Most students will complete their degree in just 60-65 credits — internships and credit for prior learning help shorten time to degree completion.



## **Criminology courses (15 credits)**

In addition to the core coursework for the BAAS, the criminology emphasis includes options designed to give you the skills you need to further your career confidence.

- POLISCI 316: Police and Criminal lustice Administration

## **Elective courses (17-22 credits)**

Select electives to reach 120 total credits, including credits awarded for previous learning or internships. For most students, that's just 17-22 elective credits.
