GRANT TUITION PAYMENT REIMBURSEMENT QUALIFYING FORM

Student Qualifying Criteria

To receive tuition reimbursement under the HOMES grant funding, students must meet all of the following demographic guidelines:

- Students must be underemployed, unemployed, or considered a special population. Special populations include:
 - Economically Disadvantaged
 - Single Parent
 - o Disabled Individual
 - First Generation
 - Veteran
 - o Person of Color
- Students must be at least 16 years of age at class start.
- Students must be enrolled in the Mechatronics Basics Technical Diploma program (30-454-1).
- Students must complete and sign both the Northwood Technical College registration form and the HOMES Grant Tuition Payment Reimbursement Qualifying Form.

Qualifying Courses

The following Mechatronics Basics courses are eligible for tuition reimbursement under the HOMES grant:

- Mechatronics Basics program courses:
 - o 32-414-335 DC Electricity (3 credits)
 - o 32-454-341 Fluid Power Systems (3 credits)
 - o 32-414-336 AC Electricity (3 credits)
 - o 32-454-345 Packaging Systems Equipment Control (3 credits)
 - o 32-454-357 Power Transmission Componentry (2 credits)
- Any Adult Basic Education course (aid code 7X) to assist with Mechatronics Basics program courses.

- If your enrollment status changes, please contact Student Services as soon as possible, to give another student the opportunity to participate in this program.
- Automated Packaging Systems Technician program students are eligible for financial aid. If these students
 choose to accept the HOMES Grant Tuition Reimbursement, they may not be eligible to receive full

Fundin
